IMAGINE EVERY CHURCH AS A RIVER.

AWE & WONDER

For real though, Shark Week is pretty epic. There is something about watching a 20-foot, 5,000 lb. animal launch itself completely OUT OF THE WATER, pursuing its prey. Majestic. Powerful. Terrifying. Awe inspiring and wonderful. Can you imagine what it would be like to see this in person, or even crazier, to be in the same water?

We often come to church with the expectation that we're here to get or do something: to serve, to drink coffee, to show off a new outfit, to feel better, to sing songs, or to listen to a talk. Way too often we are missing the point. Church isn't about getting something. It's about

experiencing someone—the God of the universe who wants to meet us here. Experiencing His power and presence.

To miss the importance of this is like missing Shark Week, but way, way worse.

We don't come to church to do something, we come to church to be with Someone. Something special happens when we gather together in the name of Jesus to sing His praise and hear His word. He's diggin' on you and is uniquely and powerfully present when we gather. What we expect often becomes what others experience.

At TLC, we expect to experience the power and presence of Christ when we gather.



OWNERS NOT RENTERS

There is a clear difference between owners and renters. If something is broken, renters call someone. Owners fix it. If something is dirty, renters leave it. Owners clean it. If something is wrong, renters ignore it. Owners take care of it. Get the picture?

Our culture has conditioned us to become consumers—to ask “what’s in it for me?” We tend to take this philosophy into our church engagement. We tend to think that the church exists to give us something to do on Sunday mornings besides sleep and that church should be convenient and meet all our needs.

At TLC, we believe church should not be a holding tank for spiritual spectators. If you get sick or hurt a hospital may put you on bed rest for a little while, but never for long periods of time. Bad things happen when we sit idle for months on end. We don’t want to sound like jerks, but we know life is so much better when we’re investors...not consumers, owners...not renters.

Together we own our health, growth, and mission. We invest what we have in order to see it take shape because we’re a community of owners.

If you have an idea, share it. If you see something wrong, help right it. We are owners.

And no, we don’t want no scrubs (see what we did there?)
