## **Digging Deeper**


- From the text above, we see God redirect David with some of his own desires and plans. Have you ever had this experience with God? Is there something else that stood out to you in the text from Sunday?

## Victories & Valleys: A study in the life of David

Ten promises God gives us:

- 1) He promises us forgiveness of sins and everlasting life (1 John 1:9, 5:11)
- 2) He promises to give us wisdom if we ask (James 1:5).
- 3) He promises to provide a way out of temptation (<u>1 Cor. 10:13</u>).
- 4) He promises that our salvation is secure, no matter what (John 10:28–29).
- 5) He promises to never leave us nor forsake us (<u>Heb. 13:5</u>).
- 6) He promises to finish the good work he has begun in us (Phil. 1:6).
- 7) He promises rest (<u>Matthew 11:28–30</u>).
- 8) He promises <u>abundant life</u> to those who follow Him (John 10:10).
- 9) He promises His disciples power from on high (<u>Acts 1:8</u>).
- 10) He promises that He will return for us (John 14:2–3).
